AN ORDINANCE Regulating Disorderly Conduct and related offenses in the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. The following shall be deemed guilty of Disorderly Conduct:

(a) All persons who shall make, aid, countenance or assist in making any improper noise, riot, disturbance, or breach of the peace or diversion tending to a breach of the peace within the limits of the Village of Bellevue;

(b) All persons who shall collect in bodies or crowds for unlawful purposes, or any purpose, to the annoyance or disturbance of other persons;

(c) All persons who are idle or dissolute and go about begging;

(d) All persons who willfully assault another within the Village of Bellevue or be engaged in or aid or abet in any fight, quarrel, or other disturbance within the Village of Bellevue;

(e) All persons who stand, loiter or stroll about in any place within the City waiting or seeking to obtain money or other valuable things from others by trick or fraud, or aid or assist therein;

(f) All persons who shall engage in any fraudulent scheme, device or trick to obtain money or other valuable things in any place within the City, or aid or abet, or in any manner be concerned therein;

(g) All persons who shall have or carry any pistol, knife, dirk, knuckles, slungshot, or other dangerous weapon concealed on or about their persons.

Eliminate

~~(h) All persons who are known to be thieves, burglars, pick pockets, robbers, or confidence men, either by their own confession or otherwise or by having been convicted of larceny,~~

burglary or other crime against the laws of the State, who are found lounging in or prowling or loitering around any steamboat landing, railroad depot, banking institution, place of public amusement, auction room, hotel, store, shop, public way, public conveyance, public gathering, public assembly, court room, public building, private dwelling house, house of ill-fame, gambling house, tippling house, or any public place, and who are unable to give a reasonable excuse for being so found;

Keep

(1) All persons who shall engage in any window peeping.

Section 2. Anyone found guilty of any one of the above offenses shall be fined not less than Twenty-five (~~\$25.00~~) Dollars, or more than One Hundred (~~\$100.00~~) Dollars for each offense that he is convicted of. *question The \$100.00 maybe it should be more.*
