

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPENING OR DIGGING IN THE PUBLIC STREETS OR ON PUBLIC PROPERTY OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, WITHOUT PRIOR PERMIT, FIXING THE FEE THEREFORE AND FINE FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IN THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to dig in the public property or open any street, highway or thoroughfare for any purpose, unless prior thereto such person has obtained a permit from the Village Clerk, stating the purpose and posting a general liability bond to protect the Village against any and all loss, damage or injury that might be suffered or sustained by any person, and also, with protection against settlement, rutting or neglect to replace the opening with material as specified by the Trustee of Streets. The amount of the liability bond shall be TWENTY-THOUSAND DOLLARS, with double for any one accident, and the replacement bond shall be for at least \$500.00, assuring that proper resurfacing of the street opened is of a fill and surface type as specified and protected for one year, after such work is performed.

SECTION 2. The permit fee shall be Three Dollars, and shall be posted at the nearest place possible along side of the opening or digging, and shall indicate the person or firm to whom granted, and the general purpose thereof, and shall remain so posted during all of the work unto completion.

SECTION 3. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any public utility company or to the Village departments performing any work in his Village.

SECTION 4. Any person or firm who violates the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be fined not less than \$15.00 nor more than \$500.00, and each day the offense continues shall be a separate fine and subject to the provisions hereof.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and due publication as provided for by law, and any conflict with other ordinances are, as to such conflict, repealed in favor of the provisions hereof.
