

ORDINANCE NO. 233

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE AGE AT WHICH PERSONS MAY BE SERVED CERTAIN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AND FIXING A FINE FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.
ENACTED, AND FINING A FINE FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to serve, furnish or sell any liquor, alcoholic beverage or cordial containing alcohol or whiskey, to any person under the age of 21 years, excepting, however, that a person of the age of 19 years or upwards, may be served beer or wine, according to the definitions of the laws of the State of Illinois.


SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided for by law.


SECTION 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or if a tavern or dram shop, such violation shall be deemed a violation of the liquor ordinances.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, as to such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 1. SECTION 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or if a tavern or dram shop, such violation shall be deemed a violation of the liquor ordinances.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, as to such conflict, hereby repealed.
