

ORDINANCE NO. 260

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING VEHICLES FROM STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING IN A SCHOOL ZONE DURING SCHOOL DAYS AND FIXING A FINE FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, IN THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to step, stand or park a vehicle in a school zone when marked by signs erected at either end thereof, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A. M. to 4:00 o'clock P. M. on days when school is in session.

SECTION 2. A school zone shall be determined to include the school grounds fronting on a public street or thoroughfare.

SECTION 3. A vehicle shall not be deemed to be stopped in a school zone when such stopping is to prevent contact with a person or another vehicle, or when directed by a police officer or school-guard.

SECTION 4. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than fifteen (\$15.00) dollars, nor more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, and costs, for each offence.

SECTION 5. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to emergency vehicles nor to police vehicles used in the performance of official duties.

SECTION 6. This ordinance is published in pamphlet form and as such, it shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and the approval thereof, in manner and form as provided for by law.
