## ORDINANCE NO. 272

AN ORDINANCE PLACING A LOAD LIMIT ON THE STREETS OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AND PROVIDING A FIRE FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PRORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

It shall be unlawful to operate or drive any vehicle upon any street having a blacktop or bituminous surface, in the Village of Bellevue, when the said vehicle, together with its load exceeds eight tons (short tons), except by a special permit granted by the President and Board of Trustees as hereinafter set forth.

SECTION 2. Anyone seeking a special permit to operate a vehicle with load exceeding eight short tons, shall first apply to the Village Board of the Village of Bellevue, stating the type of vehicle, purpose of the proposed operation and furnishing of a bond in the sum of \$200,000, to be approved by the Village Board, covering any damage that the streets may sustain. There shall also be furnished a fee for cost of the Village Engineer to examine the streets both before and ofter such use to determine if any damage has beencaused and to what extent, including the cost of repair and his determination shall be final. All permits shall be limited as to period of use and time granted. Nothing in his ordinance shall apply to Municipally operated vehicles, Emergency vehicles or those of public utilities serving this Village

SECTION 3. Any person, firm or corporation who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars, nor more than five hundred dollars, upon conviction, and costs unorcol.

SECTION in Any person, Firm or corporation shall, in addition to the Time chove provided, or subject to any and all damages to the emport and amount as determined by the Village Engineer, and the police well have the right to impound any vehicle used in such violation at the cont to the owner or operator.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication thereof in pamphlet form, and the same so published, is in full force and effect, instanter upon passage.
