

ORDINANCE NO. 585

VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, ILLINOIS

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 570,
BUILDING CODE ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Village of Bellevue ("Village") Board of Trustees passed an Ordinance Adopting Building Code, Ordinance No. 570, on December 12, 2005, which adopted the BOCA National Building Code, 14th Edition, 1999; and,

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees has determined that the health and welfare of the citizens of the Village will be served by amending Ordinance No. 570 so as to address the building materials that must be used to construct carports.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The Village building code is amended by adding the following provisions as a supplement to section 3105 of the BOCA National Building Code, 14th Edition, 1999, as published by the Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc.:

3105.6 Carport materials: No canopy shall be used as shelter for parking a motorized vehicle or boat unless the canopy, including the framework and covering, is constructed of metal or wood, and the entire ground area below such canopy consists of concrete. *

SECTION 2: All other ordinances in conflict herewith, in whole or in part, are repealed to the extent of said conflict. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any ordinance of the Village of Bellevue imposing stricter or more specific standards that those set forth herein shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and recordation as provided by law.

* Further, no canopy shall be used as shelter for storage; and no canopy shall have "sides" for a "front" or a "rear." All four sides of the canopy shall be open and unobstructed.
