MINUTES of a regular Meeting  
of the President and Board of  
Trustees of the Village of  
Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois,  
held at Village Hall  
at 7:30, P.M. on the 8  
day of August 1950.

The President called the meeting to order and directed the Village  
Clerk to call the roll. Upon roll call the following Trustees answered  
present: H. Buhs, P. Dorethy, R. Fouts, L. Gard,  
C. McDonald and the following were absent:  
L. Cowen.

Trustee R. Fouts presented, and the Village  
Clerk read in full an Ordinance set out herein below as follows:

#86

AN ORDINANCE providing for borrowing money and issuing bonds of the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois, to the amount of \$30,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing improvements and extensions to the existing water works system in and for said Village and providing for the collection of a direct annual tax for the payment of principal of said bond.

WHEREAS the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois, did by ordinance adopted on June 27, 1950, call a special election to be held in and for said Village of Bellevue on July 22, 1950, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said Village the following question:

Shall bonds in the amount of \$30,000 be issued by the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois, for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing necessary improvements to the existing water works system in and for said Village, such improvements consisting of the construction of an elevated water storage tank and necessary appurtenances incident thereto, maturing \$1,000 on June 1 of each of the years 1952 to 1962, inclusive, \$2,000 on June 1 of each of the years 1963 to 1967, inclusive, and \$3,000 on June 1 of each of the years 1968 to 1970, inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of not to exceed three and one-half per cent (3½%) per annum?

and;

WHEREAS the President and Board of Trustees did cause to be given proper notice of said election by publishing notice thereof once in the Peoria "Journal", the same being a newspaper having general circulation within said Village, there being no newspaper published in said Village, and by posting notice thereof in at least three of the most public places, said publication and posting of said notices being made not more than thirty days nor less than fifteen days prior to the date of said election, which said notices as so published and posted did specify the place where such election was to be held, the time of opening and closing the polls, and the question to be voted upon; and

WHEREAS the President and Board of Trustees by proper proceedings adopted and spread upon its records, found that all legal requirements in connection with said election were duly complied with, and that a majority of the electors of said Village voting at said election on said question above

referred to, voted in favor thereof:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That it be and it is found and determined that this President and Board of Trustees have been authorized by a majority of the electors of said Village voting on the question at a special election duly called, noticed, held and canvassed for that purpose to issue bonds of said Village in the amount of \$30,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of the construction of improvements and extensions to the existing water works system in and for said Village, such improvements and extensions consisting of the constructing of an elevated water storage tank and necessary appurtenances incident thereto.

2. That in order to raise the sum of \$30,000 needed for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing the improvements and extensions to the existing water works system of said Village, there be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois the sum of \$30,000, and that to evidence said loan negotiable coupon bonds of said Village be issued, said bonds to be designated "Water Bonds", be thirty(30) in number, and be number from 1 to 30, inclusive, be dated June 1, 1950, and mature serially \$1,000 on June 1 of each of the years 1952 to 1962, inclusive, \$2,000 on June 1 of each of the years 1963 to 1967, inclusive, and \$3,000 on June 1 of each of the years 1968 to 1970, inclusive; said bonds to bear interest from date at the rate of three and one-half per cent ( $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ ) per annum, payable December 1, 1951, and semi-annually thereafter on the first days of June and December of each year until paid, which interest payments to date of maturity of principal shall be evidenced by proper interest coupons attached to each bond, and maturing on the date herein provided; and both principal and interest shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the American National Bank and Trust Company of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois. The seal of said Village shall be affixed to each of said bonds, and said bonds shall be signed by the President and attested by the Village Clerk of said Village; and said coupons shall be signed and attested by said officials respectively by their facsimile signatures; and said officers by the execution of said bonds shall adopt as and for their respective signatures their respective facsimile signatures appearing on said coupons.

This bond is issued by said Village for the purpose of paying the cost of improving and extending the existing water works system, in and for said Village, pursuant to and in all respects in compliance with the "Revised Cities and Villages Act" effective January 1, 1942, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and is authorized by a majority of the electors of said Village voting upon the question at an election duly called, noticed, held and canvassed for that purpose in said Village, and in compliance with an ordinance duly passed by the President and Board of Trustees of said Village, approved by the President thereof, and published, in all respects as by law required.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Illinois to exist, or to be done, precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, have existed and have been properly done, happened and been performed in regular and due form and time as required by law; that the indebtedness of said Village of Bellevue, including this bond, and the issue of which it forms a part, and including all other indebtedness of said Village, howsoever evidenced and incurred, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation; and that provision has been made for the collection of a direct annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, on all the taxable property in said Village to pay the interest hereon as the same falls due and also to pay and discharge the principal hereof at maturity.

This bond is subject to registration as to principal in the name of the holder upon the books of the Treasurer of said Village, such registration to be evidenced by notation of such Treasurer on the back hereof, and after such registration no transfer hereof, except upon such books and similarly noted hereon, shall be valid, unless the last registration shall have been to bearer. Registration of this bond will not affect the negotiability of the coupons hereto attached, which shall continue negotiable by delivery merely, notwithstanding registration thereof.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the said Village of Bellevue, Peoria County, Illinois, by its President and Board of Trustees, has caused its corporate seal to be hereto affixed, and this bond to be signed by the Village President and attested by its Village Clerk, and the coupons hereto attached to be signed and attested by said officers, respectively, by their facsimile signatures, and said officers do, by the execution hereof, adopt as and for their respective proper signatures their respective facsimile signatures appearing on said coupons, all as of the first day of June 1950.

Section 5. That forthwith after this ordinance has become effective as provided by law, the bonds and coupons herein authorized shall be prepared and executed as hereinbefore provided and shall be delivered to the Treasurer of said Village and be by him delivered to Benjamin Lewis & Co., Chicago, Illinois, the purchaser thereof, upon receipt of the purchase price therefor, the same being not less than the par value thereof and accrued interest from the date of the bonds to date of delivery thereof, contract for the sale of said bonds heretofore entered into be and the same is hereby in all respects ratified, approved and confirmed, and the proceeds derived from the sale of said bonds shall be used solely and only for the purpose of paying the cost of constructing improvements and extensions to the water works system in and for said Village of Bellevue.

Section 6. That for the purpose of providing the funds required to pay the interest on said bonds promptly when and as same falls due, and to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity, there be and there hereby is levied upon all the taxable property within said Village in each year while any of said bonds are outstanding, a direct annual tax sufficient for that purpose, and that there be and there is hereby levied on all of the taxable property in said Village, in addition to all other taxes, the following direct annual tax, to-wit:

For the year 1950, a tax sufficient to produce the sum of \$3,100 for principal and interest up to and including June 1, 1952;

That principal or interest falling due at any time when there are insufficient funds on hand to pay the same, be paid promptly when due from current funds on hand in advancement of the collection of the taxes, herein levied, and when said taxes shall have been collected, reimbursement shall be made to the said funds in the amount thus advanced.

Section 7. That forthwith as soon as this ordinance becomes effective, a copy hereof, certified by the Clerk of said Village, which certificate shall recite that this ordinance has been passed by the President and Board of Trustees of said Village and published, shall be filed with the County Clerk of the County of Peoria, Illinois, who shall, in and for each of the years 1950 to 1968, both



years inclusive, ascertain the rate per cent required to produce the aggregate tax hereinbefore provided to be levied in each of said years, respectively, and extend the same for collection on the tax books in connection with other taxes levied in each of said years, respectively, in and by said Village for general corporate purposes of said Village and in each of said years such annual tax shall be levied and collected by the said Village in like manner as taxes for general purposes for each of said years are levied and collected, and when collected, such taxes shall be used for the purpose of paying principal and interest upon the bonds hereinbefore described when same mature.

Section 8. That all ordinances, resolutions and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication, as provided by law.



