AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARY TO BE PAID TO CERTAIN ADDITIONAL ELECTED OFFICIALS IN THE VILLAGE OF BELLVIEW, FLORIDA COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BEE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLVIEW, FLORIDA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the salary of the Village Clerk shall be increased to pay a total sum of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00), per annum, payable quarterly, effective with the next term of office.

SECTION 2. That the salary of the members of the Board of Trustees shall remain at TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) per meeting, with payment allowable for two meetings missed per year, together with such additional meetings for which proper excuse is made.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its due passage and the publication thereof as provided for by law, but shall not effect the terms of those persons now holding office until the now or next term commences.

SECTION 4. This ordinance is in addition to all other ordinances and shall be construed therewith, except as to direct conflict, in which case prior ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. ORDINANCE NO. 226

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBERED 114, SECTION II, thereof, BY INCREASING THE NUMBER OF POLICE OFFICERS EMPLOYED BY THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, PEORIA COUNTY, ILLINOIS:


SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 114, Section II, be amended and in its place said Section shall be as follows:

"SECTION II. There shall be employed by said Village of Bellevue, a police force of not more than six (6) officers or such number as the President and Village Board may, from time to time, determine."


SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and due publication as provided for by law.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, as to such conflict, hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING ON ANNA STREET HILL BETWEEN CLOSED ROAD AND PLANK ROAD (Route 116) IN THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, IN THE COUNTY OF PEORIA AND STATE OF ILLINOIS, AND PROVIDING FOR A FINE FOR THE VIOLATION OF SUCH PROHIBITION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEVUE, WISCONSIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to park, stand or stop for the purpose of temporary parking, any motor vehicle on ANNA STREET hill between West Clausen Road and Plank Road (Route 116), at any time.

SECTION 2. Nothing herein shall apply to emergency vehicles in the performance of their duty nor to stops made necessary by conditions beyond the control of the vehicle operator in emergency conditions.

SECTION 3. Any vehicle found in violation of this provision shall be towed away by the police department, and an arrest citation shall be issued.

SECTION 4. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) nor more than ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00), plus costs of towing and storage, if any, prior to the vehicle being released.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and due publication as provided for by law, and any ordinance or part thereof in conflict shall, as to such conflict, be and the same is hereby repealed.
